GRADING POLICY

The Covenant Preparatory School uses a numerical grading scale based on a 5.0 scale:

CLASS RANK

As a college preparatory school, Covenant uses a selective admissions process and offers students a rigorous and advanced curriculum. Based on the selective admissions process, Covenant's population is atypical; thus, for most students, ranking by GPA would not accurately reflect the student's accomplishments and capabilities. Therefore, Covenant does not rank students beyond determination of the class valedictorian and salutatorian.

HUMANITIES DIVISION AT COVENANT

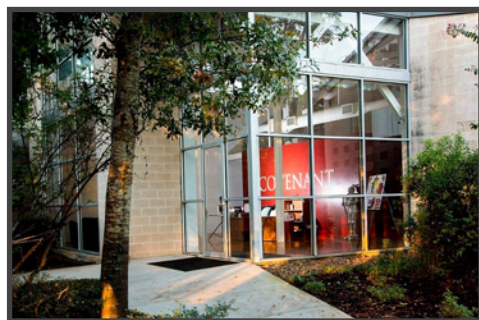
The specific methodology of the high school Humanities experience emphasizes the imparting to our students a mastery of certain skills rather than a mere memorization of facts and data.

It is a **precise method of directed dialogue**, sometimes known as the Harkness Method. This learning is centered around a large "Harkness table" and is process-oriented. It involves planning, outlining, reviewing, peer-editing, questioning, rehearsing, etc.—all with intensive teacher involvement at each stage of the process.

Teachers are dedicated to the success of their students as each step of the process is accomplished.

FACULTY PROFILE

Covenant employs highly qualified faculty and administrators who are college graduates with concentrated preparation in the subject areas they teach. 30% of the faculty and administration have earned post-graduate degrees. Average class size is 15 students per class.
